The National Economics Challenge (NEC) tests micro and macroeconomic principles as well as knowledge of the world economy. Through written exams, presentation-based critical thinking rounds, and on-stage quiz bowls, students compete for the national championship. The competition runs in two divisions:

ADAM SMITH: For first-time Challenge competitors who have taken no more than one economics course
DAVID RICARDO: For AP, international baccalaureate, and honors students (as well as any returning competitors)
